Mayor Wentz called to order the regular meeting of the Rockwell City Council at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 21, 2023. Council members present were Worley, Meyer, Morrison and Emhoff with Koob via phone. Also present were Kylie Hare, Blake Pommrehn, Sean Hannah, Zach Laudner and Chief Brunstein.

Morrison moved to approve the minutes of the May 17, 2023 meeting. Motion seconded by Emhoff, carried unanimously.

Meyer moved to approve the minutes of the May 31, 2023 meeting. Motion seconded by Worley, carried unanimously.

Worley moved to open the public hearing at 7:05 p.m. to discuss the 2022-2023 Budget Amendment. Motion seconded by Emhoff, carried unanimously.

Weier reviewed the 2022-2023 Budget Amendment. With no other discussion, Meyer moved to close the public hearing. Motion seconded by Emhoff, carried unanimously.

Morrison moved to approve the 2022-2023 Budget Amendment by Resolution 2023-5. Motion seconded by Emhoff. With roll call vote, ayes; Worley, Meyer, Morrison, Emhoff and Koob. Motion carried unanimously.

Blake Pommrehn was present on behalf of Five Star as the Energy Sales Manager. Pommrehn discussed what Five Star can offer for fuel service for the City of Rockwell. With discussions, Council will review this and discuss at the next meeting. Pommrehn left the meeting.

Meyer stated that he feels the City could host a Farmers Market, noting that interest has been out there and would like to see something like this in town. Emhoff noted that she has vendors and food trucks that are interested. Emhoff also noted that Chamber Acres may be a good place to hold this with electricity already there. Hannah felt that Main Street would be walkable for most people in town. Council agreed to look into doing something with a Farmers Market.

Kylie Hare was present to ask about removing the broken sidewalk in front of her residence, noting she does not want to replace this. Council noted they would like to look at the entire sidewalk, Morrison moved to table the sidewalk removal until Council could look at it. Motion seconded by Meyer, carried unanimously.

Mayor Wentz stated that July brings the annual two percent increase on the utilities billed by the City. With discussion, Meyer moved to approve the two percent utility rates. Motion seconded by Worley, carried unanimously.

Mayor Wentz asked for review and discussion on the City Policy and Personnel Policy. Emhoff noted the policy for the police car and the businesses for charges that need changes. With discussion, Meyer moved to make changes in the policy: 3. Police car shall be kept at the Police/EMT building or at the Police Chief residence. Also, on number five to eliminate the Rockwell Area Market for charge purposes. Motion seconded by Morrison, carried unanimously.

Council also discussed the overtime and comp time policy and felt at this time to leave it as stated.

Mayor Wentz discussed payroll raises for the City employees with the 2023 fiscal year starting July 1st. Emhoff moved to allow a three percent increase for employees: Chief Brunstein ninety-five cent increase; Laudner eighty cent increase and Weier seventy-two cent increase. Motion seconded by Worley. Meyer noted that the new employee started at a higher rate than we had originally planned and would like to have a pay scale in place for future use. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Wentz presented a note from Siefken noting his final pay. Meyer asked if this is the correct way of paying out time and vacation. Weier will check with the Auditor. Morrison moved to allow for the request as written pending approval with the Auditor. Motion seconded by Meyer, carried unanimously.

Meyer noted a nuisance area as well as needing mowed. A letter can be sent. Other nuisance and mowing concerns were discussed.

Morrison noted that the dog issues continue as well. Chief Brunstein asked what the Council wanted to set the fine at as the Code reads an amount up to \$750.00.

Laudner asked the Council about attending the fall water conference for CEU credits, the conference is \$170 with hotel cost additional. Council approved the conference for Laudner.

Laudner stated he and John put together the benches and the trash cans at the playground. Mayor Wentz noted that John Roberts started on Monday and welcomed him aboard.

Chief Brunstein told the Council he had granted permission to a property owner, at the edge of town, to take care of skunks.

Chief Brunstein reported on the National Night Out meeting. With the cost of a DJ being high, the committee is asking to purchase speakers with the donations and sponsorships they have. Brunstein noted the speakers could be used elsewhere as well. Council approved this. National Night Out is August 1st.
